## \$126,539

In 2024, United Way invested \$126,539 in Forsyth County Schools programs to make sure children and youth have a foundation to reach their full potential.

## 96.2% Graduation Rate

Since 2008, United Way has funded \$941,196 to Credit Recovery programs. Additionally, the graduation rate in Forsyth County has increased from 85.8% in 2008 to 96.2% in 2024.



# FINANCIAL SECURITY



**\$157,000**

Through our partnership with AARP Foundation Tax-Aide 576 tax returns were prepared in 2024, saving taxpayers approximately \$157,000 in filing fees. This program is offered FREE to those earning \$54,000 or less and those individuals 60 and older.



**140,000**

Through United Way's 23rd Annual Day of Caring, 140,000 oatmeal and rice & vegetable soup meals were packaged; 2,000 family snack packs were packaged; and 1,000 school supply kits were assembled by approximately 651 volunteers.



**\$48,332**

In 2024, 100 households representing 238 individuals were served through 123 acts of kindness and \$48,332 in financial assistance was provided by United Way of Forsyth County.

# HEALTHY COMMUNITY



**\$36,731**

In collaboration with Forsyth County Schools, United Way of Forsyth County is invested in our students' overall health by providing \$36,731 for on-site therapeutic services to students when costs were more than the family could afford. This equates to approximately 615 therapeutic sessions.



**884 Patients**

In 2024, United Way's partner agency, Georgia Highlands provided primary care to 884 patients with 1,744 medical visits through the School Based Health Center at Cumming Elementary. Georgia Highlands waived the fee for 75 homeless students (156 medical visits).
